

## The <u>Augar report</u> into post 18 education: much more than university tuition fees.

In addition to a wide ranging review of the current post 18 system, the independent panel report makes 53 recommendations for the government focused on: skills, higher education, further education, apprenticeships, the student contribution (finance) system, and a post 18 maintenance system.

# Deep dive reviews will form a key part of the Ofsted inspector's toolkit under EIF.
